
The TALK Centre provides the children and young people's mental health and wellness workforce in Norfolk and Waveney with a hub offering access to training, learning and knowledge resources



The Children and Young People's Charter


Created by young people, in partnership with Youth in Mind, the Children and Young People's Charter outlines the specific ways that children and young people want mental health services to work for them
