Reaching Out on Sexual Exploitation

Partnership working with the MASH

- Young peoples team is co-located within the MASH
- Work alongside the Missing and CSE teams
- Referrals for CSE and Missing come through from the MASH as Norfolk protocol
- Referrals are for medium and high risk cases

CSE Befriending

September 2013- August 2014

- 62 referrals plus 27 through missing
- 52 young people engaged with befriending
- 220 befriending sessions carried out
- 49% in care or leaving care
- 9% young people have gone on to engage with education, volunteering, training or employment
- 70% have reported increase in knowledge of awareness and staying safe from sexual exploitation

Runaways

September 2013- August 2014

- 194 referrals
- 84 Return Home Interviews conducted with 65 young people
- 41% in care or leaving care
- 30% correlation of child sexual exploitation and missing
- 42% of young people at risk of CSE have engaged in befriending
- 18% young people have moved away from sexually exploitative situations

Jigsaw Education Programme

September 2011- August 2014- 3 year evaluation

- 19,478 children and young people impacted
- 183 parents and carers impacted
- 976 professionals trained
- 86% of students have increased knowledge of awareness and staying safe from sexual exploitation

Organisations Impacted

September 2011- August 2014

- 166 primary schools impacted
- 34 secondary schools impacted
- 23 voluntary sector organisations
- 11 statutory sector organisations

Professionals trained from: Norfolk Children Services, YMCA Norfolk, Health, Youth Offending Team, DASVB group, Stonham Housing

Targeted Support

- Targeted support work to those young people who are vulnerable to CSE but may not have reached the MASH criteria for a referral
- 3 courses; Healthy Relationships, Exploitative Relationships and Internet Safety which are all 6 weeks long
- Creative and informal workshops to help equip young people with the tools to stay safe
